PHILEMON

^{1.1} Paul, a prisoner of The Anointed One, Yeho'shua and Timothy our brother,

To Philemon our beloved and fellow worker, ^{1,2} and to Apphia our sister, and to Archippus our fellow soldier, and to the church in your house: ^{1,3} Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Yeho'shua, The Anointed One.

1.4 I thank my God always, making mention of you in my prayers 1.5 (because I hear of your love and of the faith which vou have toward the Lord Yeho'shua and toward all the holy ones) 1.6 that the fellowship of your faith may become through effective the knowledge of every good thing which is in you toward The Anointed One. 1.7 For I have come to have much joy and comfort in your love, because the hearts of the holy ones have been refreshed through you, brother.

^{1.8} Therefore, though I have much confidence in The Anointed One to order you *to do* what is proper, ^{1.9} yet for

love's sake I rather appeal to you (since I am such a person as Paul, the elderly, and now also a prisoner of The Anointed One, Yeho'shua).

^{1.10} I appeal to you for my child Onesimus, whom I have begotten in my imprisonment, 1.11 (who formerly was useless to you, but now is useful both to you and to me). 1.12 I have sent him back to you in person, that is, sending my very heart, 1.13 whom I wished to keep with me, so that on your behalf he might minister to me in my imprisonment for the gospel; 1.14 but without your consent I did not want to do anything, so that your goodness would not be, in effect, by compulsion but of your own free will. 1.15 For perhaps he was for this reason separated from you for a while, that you would have him back forever, 1.16 no longer as a slave, but more than a slave, a loved one, a brother, especially to me, but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord.

1.17 If then you regard me a partner, accept him as *if it were*

me. ^{1.18} But if we has wronged you in any way or owes you anything, charge that to my account; ^{1.19} I, Paul, am writing this with my own hand, I will repay it (besides, I will not mention that you owe me even your own self). ^{1.20} Yes, brother, let me benefit from you in the Lord; refresh my heart in The Anointed One.

1.21 Having confidence in your obedience, I write to you,

since I know that you will do even more than what I say.

1.22 At the same time also prepare me a lodging, for I hope that through your prayers I will be given to you. 1.23 Epaphras, my fellow prisoner in The Anointed One, Yeho'shua, greets you, 1.24 as do Mark, Aristarchus, Demas, Luke, my fellow workers.

1.25 The grace of the Lord Yeho'shua, The Anointed One, be with your spirit.
